John 13

¹It was just before the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he now showed them the full extent of his love.

²The evening meal was being served, and the devil had already prompted Judas Iscariot, son of Simon, to betray Jesus. ³Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; ⁴so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. ⁵After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him.

⁶He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?"

⁷Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

⁸"No," said Peter, "you shall never wash my feet."

Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with me."

⁹"Then, Lord," Simon Peter replied, "not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!"

¹⁰Jesus answered, "A person who has had a bath needs only to wash his feet; his whole body is clean. And you are clean, though not every one of you." ¹¹For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean.

¹²When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. ¹³"You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. ¹⁴Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. ¹⁵I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. ¹⁶I tell you the truth, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. ¹⁷Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them.

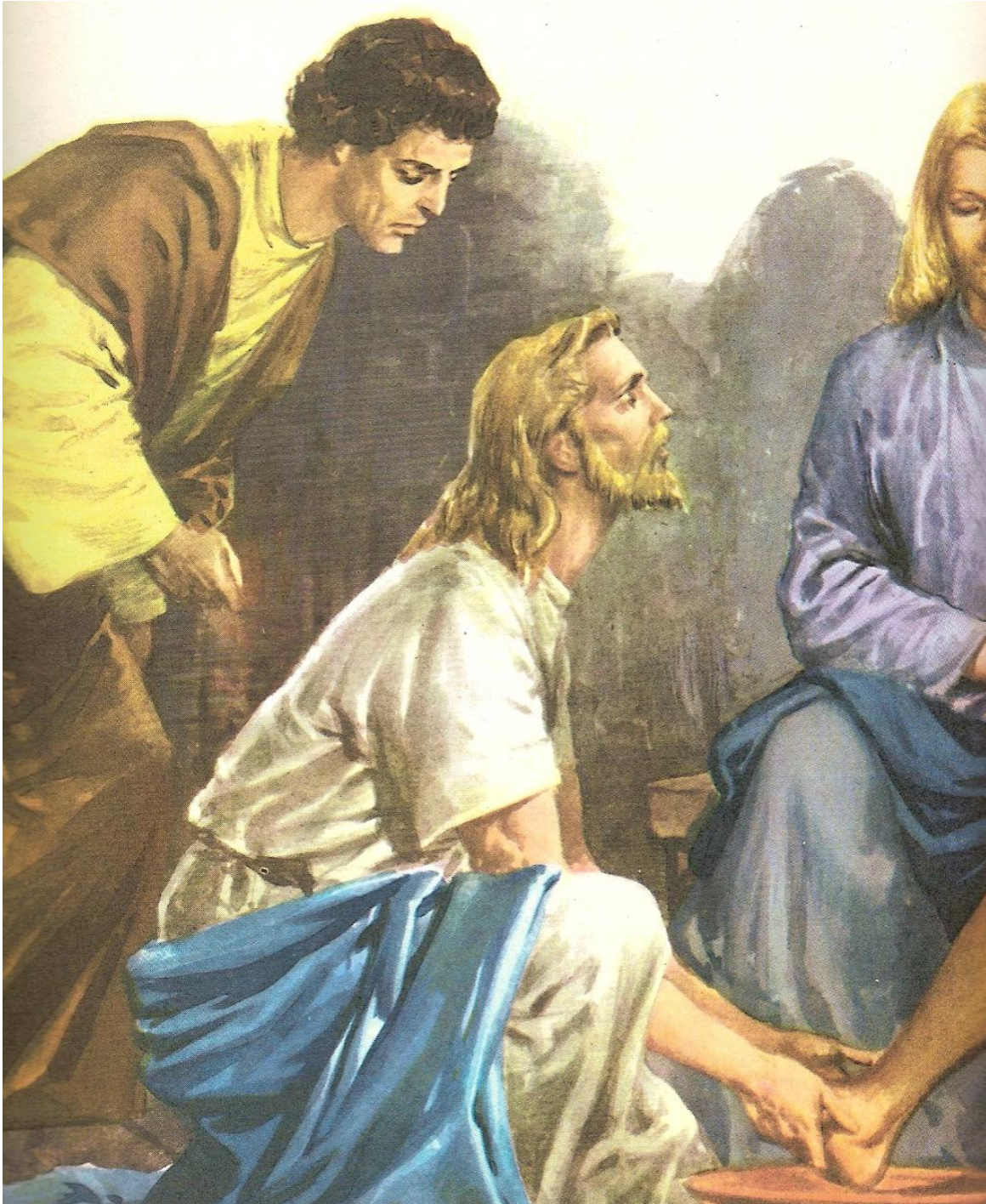

CRAFT/ACTIVITY: WASH BASINS

Students will make wash basins to remind them that Jesus washed his disciples' feet as an example to us.

MATERIALS

1. 67 lb. Cardstock
2. Feet Pattern
3. Crayons, Markers, or Colored Pencils
4. Glue
5. Scissors
6. Paper Bowls
7. Paper Towels



DIRECTIONS

1. Make copies of the feet pattern for each student onto 67 lb cardstock.
2. Have students color the feet and cut them out.
3. Glue the feet into a paper bowl.
4. Glue a paper towel into the bowl.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are working on their wash basins, remind them that we need to be more like Jesus who humbled himself and washed his disciples' feet. Often times we are willing to serve others when it is not too far out of our comfort zone; when it is, we tend to shy away from the task. Encourage students to do for others even when it is humbling.

Approximately 10 minutes

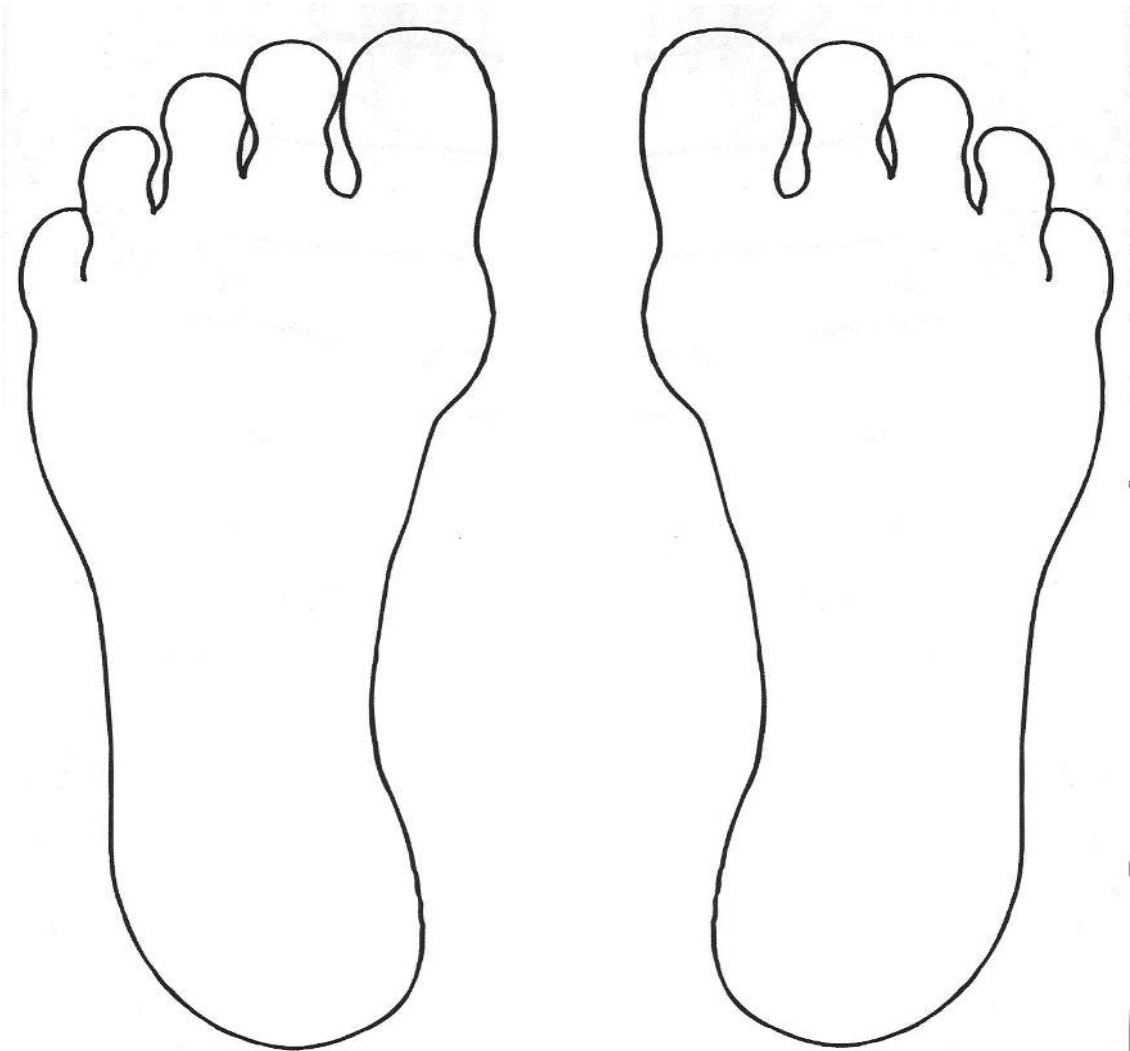

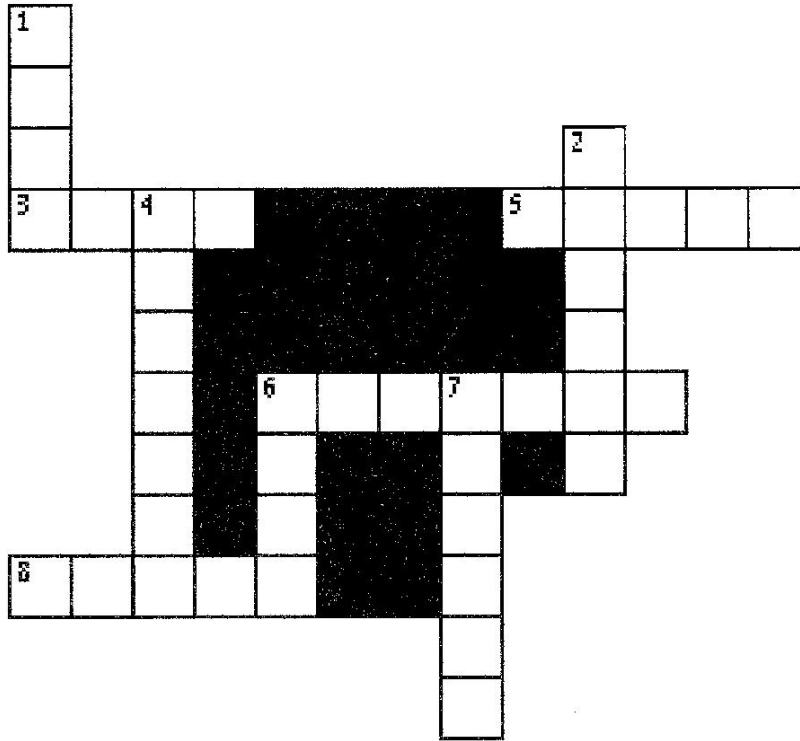

While the meal was being served, Jesus got up and took off his outer clothing and wrapped a towel around his waist. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet. Jesus used the towel that was wrapped around his waist to dry the disciples' feet.

Simon Peter did not want Jesus to wash his feet. But Jesus told Simon Peter that unless he washed his feet, Simon would not have any part of Jesus.

Simon Peter said, "Then, Lord, not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!"

Jesus washed his disciples' feet as an example of what his disciples should do for others. Jesus wanted his disciples to serve others just as Jesus served them.
